

WHAT'S THE SCHOLARSHIP AND HOW TO APPLY FOR IT 2026/2027 A.Y.

The current presentation DOES NOT replace, in any way, the official call for application; it only aims to help you better understand the application procedure.



APPLICATION TO PARTICIPATE IN THE COMPETITION IS TO BE SUBMITTED **ONLY ONLINE**(**WWW.EDISU.PV.IT**), IN THE “ONLINE STUDENT SERVICES” SECTION

The scholarships to be awarded for the 2026/2027 academic year are financed by the the Ministry of University and Research (MUR) and the Lombardy Region and other public or private bodies.

Prior enrollment at the Pavia University is NOT a mandatory requirement for the application although enrolment procedures must be completed within the deadlines indicated in art. 4 (except for students enrolled in the “filter semester”).



CONFIRMATION of the online application must be made by no later
than **September 15, 2026, at 3 pm**

GENERAL COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS



Be duly enrolled at the University of Pavia for the 2026/2027 academic year to the date of **16 of November 2026:**

- ✓ Enrolment, *for the first time*, in the first year of a bachelor's degree, master's degree or a single cycle master's degree programme (Students enrolled in the 1st year of a master's degree, if they have not already obtained a bachelor's degree, can be registered as "enrolled under condition" but they have to complete enrolment procedures in compliance with the terms and conditions prescribed).
- ✓ Enrolment *in the "filter semester"* of Medicine and Surgery course or Dentistry and Dental Prosthodontics course having chosen the University of Pavia as first location to continue the course of study.
- ✓ Enrolment *in an extra year* (i.e., one year beyond the course's prescribed length) of a bachelor's degree, master's degree or a single cycle master's degree programme (1° year «fuori corso»);
- ✓ Enrolment in a *specialization course* (with the exception of those pertaining to the field of medicine as defined by Legislative Decree 368/99);
- ✓ Enrolment in a *PhD programme* (if not already a recipient of a scholarship)

The competition is also open to *students with disabilities* – students with recognized disabilities (as defined by the law n. 104/1993, or whose level of disability is 66% or higher) who are enrolled for a further 2 years beyond the regular duration of their course of any bachelor's degree, master's degree or a single cycle master's degree programme.



Meet the merit-based requirements, including *steadiness in academic progress*, and the *income-based requirements* listed later.

WHO'S NOT CONSIDERED ELIGIBLE?

- ✗ Students who *hold a degree of the same level as, or superior to*, the one for which the scholarship is being requested for the 2026/2027 academic year;

Example: In 2023/2024 I achieved a Bachelor Degree in Philosophy, in 2026/2027 I decide to enrol in another Bachelor Degree course, for example Economics -> in this case I cannot be eligible for the college placement since I already hold a degree of the same level.

- ✗ The *recipient*, in the same academic year, *of a scholarship* awarded by another **public or private institution**;
- ✗ Those who enrol at the University of Pavia after having, in previous years, withdrawn (at the University of Pavia or another Italian/foreign university) from a course that requested the same admission qualifications as the course in which they intend to enrol in 2026/2027 a.y.

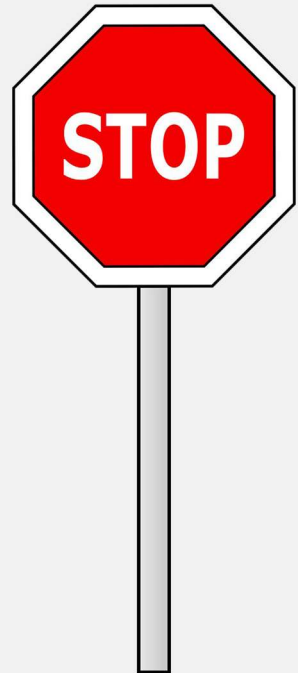
Example: is excluded the student who in the 2026/2027 a.y. enrol in the 1° year of a bachelor's degree or single-cycle master's degree course but, in previous years, has withdrawn from a bachelor's degree or master's degree course at any university.

- ✗ Those who are enrolled and *repeating an intermediate year* of their course;

Example: is excluded the student enrolled in the 2° year, as repeating student, of the Medicine and Surgery course.

- ✗ Those who are *transferring to a different degree course or from another university* and have to repeat the same year of the course in which they were previously enrolled (at Pavia University or another University);

BUT THERE'S AN EXCEPTION



Is eligible the student who has repeated a year of course, even after renewing the enrolment following formal withdrawal from a course, but *has anyway completed the number of CFU required* to access the ranking list according to *attachment A* (CFU recognized for the course of study in which the student intends to enrol for the a.y. 2026-2027).

The calculation of the minimum number of CFU, required for eligibility, is calculated starting from *the year of absolute enrolment*.

This waiver **DOES NOT APPLY** to students enrolled in the *1st year of any degree course* or to those enrolled in any year of a PhD programme or specialisation course.

EX: in 2024/2025 the student attends the 1° year of a three-year bachelor's course in Biological Sciences. In 2025/2026, after withdrawing from the Biological Sciences course, he enrolls in the 1° year of the Geological Sciences course. If this student requests, in 2026/2027, the scholarship as a student intending to enroll in the 2° year of Geological Sciences bachelor's degree, he will be eligible for the assignment of the benefit only if he has completed the number of CFU required for students who are enrolling in the 3° year of Geological Sciences, by August 10, 2026.

WHAT'S THE YEAR OF **ABSOLUTE ENROLMENT**?

The phrase “**absolute enrolment**” refers to any **previous enrolment in any Bachelor or Single Cycle Master Degree Course course** (even one different from the one attended in the current academic year) **at any Italian or Foreign University**, that has required the same qualifications as those required for enrolment in the course attended in the current academic year in Pavia, **regardless of the results of previous study** (withdrawal from the course, university transfer, graduation, etc.) *and the number of years that have elapsed since.*

Example: in 2024/2025 the student attends the first year of a bachelor's course at Milan University. In 2026/2027, after withdrawing from Milan, the student enrolls in the regular first year of a bachelor's course at Pavia University. If this student requests, in 2026/2027, EDiSU benefits he needs to indicate as **ABSOLUTE ENROLLMENT** the a.y. *2024/2025*.

Example: in 2024/2025 the student starts the first year of a bachelor's course a Foreign University. In 2026/2027, after withdrawing from the foreign university, the student enrolls in the regular first year of Medicine course at Pavia University. If this student requests, in 2026/2027, EDiSU benefits he needs to indicate as **ABSOLUTE ENROLLMENT** the a.y. *2024/2025*.

*The evaluation of the secondary school's mark **DOES NOT APPLY** to students with disabilities.

SECOND EVALUATION**ARE YOU ELIGIBLE AFTER THE FIRST EVALUATION?**

In order to maintain the eligibility and to continue to receive the scholarship (according to available funding), you must complete a **minimum number of credits** (as per Attachment B of this notice) **within the given deadlines** (registered in your booklet and recognized for your course of study).



Eligibility of students attending a PhD or postgraduate course: be regularly registered as second-year students on their course.

N.B: *If the course schedule foresees that the student can achieve, in the a.y. 2026/2027, a number of CFU that's less than 60, the merit requirements set out in the chart **are redefined in proportion to the CFU actually achievable.***

CFU EXCLUDED:

- deriving from **supernumerary/elective** exams
- the CFU registered, after a course transfer/change, with **enrolment renewal to a course year** already attended
- CFU validated for a master's degree course but **deriving from a bachelor's degree title**

IN DETAILS

STUDENT BENEFICIARY OF THE SCHOLARSHIP

- 
- if you complete the minimum number of university CFU (provided in Annex B of this notice) by 10 of August 2027, you will be confirmed as *fully eligible for the scholarship* and will be able to access 100% of the scholarship (full-service fee, full monetary fee, exemption of all university fees)

You haven't met the 10 of august deadline?

- if you complete the minimum number of university CFU (provided in Annex B of this notice) after 10 of august 2027 but still before 30 of november 2027, your eligibility for the scholarship will be confirmed but you'll be able to benefit ONLY from the 50% of the value of the benefit. Therefore, the second monetary instalment will **NOT** be recognized.

STUDENT ELIGIBLE BUT NOT BENEFICIARY

- if you complete the minimum number of university CFU (provided in Annex B of this notice) by 30 of november 2027, the benefit of one meal per day in bracket one (4,00€) and the exemption from the payment of all university fees will be confirmed.



REVOCATION OF THE SCHOLARSHIP

If you don't complete the required CFU within 30 of november 2027, you'll have to **return to EDiSU** the amount received with the 1° instalment (value of the services used and money collected).

✓ Second and third-year PhD students: must be regularly enrolled.

N.B: If the courses foresees that the student can achieve a number of CFU that's less than 60 (for each year completed), the merit requirements set out in **Attachment A** are **redefined in proportion to the credits actually achievable**.

IN DETAILS

STUDENT BENEFICIARY OF THE SCHOLARSHIP



- You are entitled to collect the entire benefit (full-service fee, full monetary fee, exemption of all university fees).

STUDENT ELIGIBLE BUT NOT BENEFICIARY

- You are entitled to n.1 free meal per day and to the exemption from the payment of all university fees.



MERIT-BASED REQUIREMENTS FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

In the case of **students with disabilities** - students with a recognized disability as defined by the law n. 104 or whose level of disability is 66% or higher (to be documented by means of a specific certificate, to be attached as in the reserved area “On-line Student Services”/Upload Documents) the merit-based requirements can be defined individually and **may differ by up to 40% from the standard requirements listed in Attachment A and B** of the present Call for Applications.



It is responsibility of the candidate to check in his Student Booklet (*Libretto dello Studente*) **that all exams passed** (as included in the student’s most recently approved study plan) are correctly registered. **It is also responsibility of the candidate**, and is in his own interests, **to notify EDiSU** when the provisional ranking list is issued (**by submitting a “review request”**), **of any unrecorded marks** or any cases of marks which are “pending approval” by Pavia University.

SUBS. YEARS

Students enrolled in further years (not first-year students) of a bachelor's degree, master's degree or a single cycle master's degree course can avail themselves of a **bonus** ("crediti bonus") which can be used to make up the difference between the minimum CFU required to enter the competition and the actual number of completed CFU.

if requested for the first time in **the years subsequent to the third year** of the academic programme (ex: 2° year Master degree*, from 4° year of a Master's single cycle degree, 1° year over time of BA, Master or Master's single cycle degree)

N.B.

Example

A student, enrolled in the 2024/2025 a.y. for the 1° time in a Master's single cycle degree course, in the 2026/2027 a.y. applies for a college placement as student enrolling in the 3° year. He has only 75 CFU and decides, **for the first time in his university career**, to use the bonus points to achieve the minimum CFU required which are 80.

His bonus credits are 12. In the 2026/2027 a.y. the student will use only 5 of his bonus CFU. The 7 remaining bonus CFU can be used in subsequent years (**"the bonus package" has been «opened» in the year in which contains 12 CFU; they can all be used in one academic year or, if just some of them have been used, the remaining ones can be used in subsequent years.** **The number of bonus points that the student can use during his entire academic career will correspond to the number of bonus points contained in the package when was first opened..** That's because, once the package is opened, it cannot accumulate additional bonus points).

→ The request of possible «use» of the bonus package must be done during the online application (there's a paragraph asking if you want to use the bonus points and you must tick yes)

→ If you reach the required CFU by yourself then the bonus point will not be used, even if you've previously ticked yes in the online application

→ "Bonus credits" accrued and not used in the bachelor's degree course may be used if the student enrolls in a master's degree course.

→ "Bonus credits" which are not used in the academic year in which the student first requests their use may be used in subsequent years.

* Students enrolled in a master's degree course and holding a bachelor's **degree NOT obtained in Italy**, begin to earn bonus points only from their first enrolment in a master's degree course in Italy.

Bonus points **cannot be used** by **first year students** to meet the merit requirements.

INCOME-BASED REQUIREMENTS

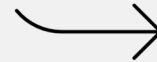
an equivalent asset situation indicator (ISPE = ISP of the family unit $\div$ equivalence scale coefficient)

Both must be fulfilled: if even one of these indicators exceeds, applicants do not meet the income-based requirements!



STUDENTS WITH INCOME AND ASSETS IN ITALY

These values are indicated in the **ISEE UNI 2026** statement that is issued by the INPS within 7-10 business days following submission of the **DSU (Dichiarazione Sostitutiva Unica)**



Italian or foreign students residing in Italy, with income and assets in Italy, must apply directly to **INPS or through a CAF**



Deadline to apply to INPS:

September 15, 2026



EDiSU **WILL NOT CONSIDER VALID** any indicators referring to the **ordinary ISEE** or statements that contain **notes referring to missing data or any discrepancies** detected by INPS.



Failure to submit the request to INPS for the issuance of the ISEE 2026 Certificate by September 15, 2025, **leads to the exclusion** of the student from the **scholarship ranking list**



STUDENTS WITH INCOME AND ASSETS IN ITALY

EDiSU, as authorized by the applicant when completing the online application, will retrieve from the **ISEE database of INPS**, the latest **ISEE UNI 2026 Certificate** issued in the name of the student requesting the benefit (research carried out based on the Tax Code of the student) and requested **no later than September 15, 2026.**

In some situations, in the presence of adverse events (for example, the loss of a job, the interruption of social security payment, welfare and indemnity treatment) or a significant variation in the income of the household, this income may **not reflect the real economic situation of the family unit.** The possibility to submit a **CURRENT ISEE by and no later than September 15, 2026** is therefore given.

The **CURRENT ISEE** is calculated on the income of the last twelve months and is valid for six months from the moment of presentation.

The student **must NOT upload the ISEE 2026** certification in the "Upload documents" section of the reserved area ("Online Student Services"). While completing the online application, the **student only has to authorize** EDiSU Pavia to access the INPS database in order to collect his ISEE 2026 certification.

The data on income and assets used for the DSU and the **2026 ISEE UNI statement** refer to the **two previous calendar years** (therefore 2024 for the ISEE UNI 2026 Statement).



The student, within his User Profile "On-line student services" on the EDiSU Pavia website, will be able to view in real time the ISEE 2026 Certificate considered for the requested benefit.

Students with **non-compliant ISEE indicators** will be considered **NOT ELIGIBLE "for income"** in the provisional ranking list unless they request (within the deadline established for the appeal) the issuance of a new ISEE 2026 Attestation for the right to university study that is in compliance with the regulations.

THE STUDENT'S FAMILY UNIT

IF THE STUDENT RESIDES WITH THE FAMILY

The family unit of the student attending university whilst residing with his/her parents, is the one made up of those members registered in the civil registry, as shown on the Family Status certificate.



If the student does not live with his/her parents but is not “independent”, he/she must be considered a member of his/her parents’ family unit.



INDEPENDENT STUDENT

- ✓ **Requirement 1:** The student **has been domiciled**, as registered in the civil registry, away from the parental household for a period of at least two years prior to the date of submission of the application and has been residing in accommodation which is not owned by a member of his original family unit;
- ✓ **Requirement 2:** The student has personal income deriving from employment or similar, provided that the student is not employed by a family member, and that income has been declared to the tax office for **at least the past two years** and amounts to **AT LEAST € 9,000.00 per annum***.

FAMILY UNIT OF THE PHD STUDENT



- ❖ Is composed by the applicant himself/herself, his/her spouse, minor and adult children, if dependent and even if not cohabiting (“restricted nucleus”, with no other persons cohabiting)

Or, if more favourable,

- ❖ Is composed by all persons present in the family status on the date of submission of the Dichiarazione Sostitutiva Unica.

*If both conditions are **NOT SATISFIED** and not duly documented for all the years of reference at the time of application to EDiSU, the student **cannot be considered independent** and will **be excluded** from the scholarship ranking list unless he requests, within the deadline for submitting revision requests, the issue of a new ISEE 2025 per il diritto allo studio universitario in which he/she is treated as a member of his/her original family unit.*

*The status of independent student is also applicable to **legally married students** or students in a “**de facto state of cohabitation**” registered at the Municipality of residence. In this case the minimum income of € 9,000.00 refers to the total income, including that of the spouse/de facto cohabitant.



INCOME-BASED REQUIREMENTS

STUDENTS WITH INCOME AND ASSETS OVERSEAS

The financial status of foreign students whose family unit resides abroad or of Italian students residing abroad is determined by the Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator abroad statement (**ISEE parificato**) calculated as:

OVERSEAS INCOME of each member of the family unit



20% OF THE ASSETS (movable and non-movable) owned by each component



The abovementioned documents **must be** issued by competent Authorities in the country in which the income was made and in which any buildings and financial assets are owned, **LEGALISED** by the Italian Diplomatic Authorities acting in that country, together with an **ITALIAN TRANSLATION CERTIFIED** by the same Authorities. For countries that are members of the Hague Convention, authentication can be performed by using an **APOSTILLE**.

The result of this sum is **DIVIDED BY THE EQUIVALENCE SCALE COEFFICIENT** determined by the number of members of the family unit of reference.

NB: Photocopied documents will **NOT** be accepted/evaluated.

So, if your family has income and assets abroad, you must submit to EDiSU original hard copy documents* stating:

*This applies even if you don't live in the same household as your parents residing abroad, but you can't be considered "independent" yet.

the composition of the **family unit**, including the student, other family members and any person officially residing with the family unit (indicating date of birth and the nature of the relationship)

the gross income received abroad in **2025**, or an unemployment statement referring to 2024

the number of any buildings owned abroad as of **December 31, 2025**, including surface measurement in square meters, or a document stating that no one owns a property

the amount of any movable assets (bank statement) as of **December 31, 2025**

for each adult member of the family unit



STUDENTS WITH INCOME AND ASSETS OVERSEAS

For those countries where it is particularly difficult to have documents certified by a local Italian Embassy, *as an alternative* an original certification of income and assets owned can be submitted, in the Italian language, by the diplomatic or consular representation in Italy of the foreign country. The certification issued by the diplomatic or consular representation in Italy must be LEGALISED BY A PREFECTURE and must expressly refer to the documents originally issued in the country of origin.

For foreign students coming from particularly POOR COUNTRIES the evaluation of their financial status is based on a *statement issued by an Italian consular agent* in the country of origin, or by *Diplomatic Authorities* of the country of origin in Italy, certifying that the student does not belong to a family with known high income and social status.

Students holding the *status of stateless person or political refugee* or holders of subsidiary or *special protection* are treated as Italian citizens and, for the purpose of evaluating their financial condition, are exempt from submitting statements issued by Embassies and Consulates, because the only elements that will be considered are any income and assets possessed in Italy, which must be certified in the same manner as for Italian students (ISEE UNI statement). The stateless person/political refugee/holder of subsidiary or special protection status must be substantiated by evidence provided by applicants through official documents, in date and valid. These documents must be attached (uploaded) in electronic document format to the online application and later handed in at the EDiSU help desk.

NB. For the submission of foreign documents it is only possible to access the EDiSU counters by **APPOINTMENT** (by opening a new "Appointment SRM" in your personal area of EDiSU)

In the event that the original foreign documentation, submitted by September 15, 2026, prove to be *incomplete/incorrect*, the student shall be excluded from the provisional ranking. Applicants may, however and within 10 days from the publication of the provisional ranking list, *apply to revise their application* and to present additional original certifications, in addition to the previous documentation, to replace incomplete/missing documents.



STUDENTS WITH INCOME AND ASSETS OVERSEAS

Any income made abroad and declared by foreign students **must amount to NO LESS than € 10.179,85** (the annual social allowance amount) which is the established minimum amount required for supporting oneself.

In **NO CASE** whatsoever will any form of self-certification, substitute statement, affidavit or sworn declaration referring to income and/or assets abroad **be accepted**. If any of these types of documents are submitted, they will **NOT BE TAKEN INTO CONSIDERATION**.

- Foreign students **residing with their families in Italy**, *with no income or assets abroad*, are only required to submit the ISEE UNI 2026 certificate.
- Foreign students whose immediate **family unit is wholly or partly abroad** and who also have income and/or assets in Italy (even if they only have a bank account in Italy) are also required to present, in addition to the original foreign documentation, **the ISEE UNI 2026** and are obliged to declare any income and assets held in Italy through an ISEE UNI statement.
- If the student does not live in the same household as their parents residing abroad but is not “independent”, he will be considered as a member of their parents' household and must therefore present foreign documentation related to their household.

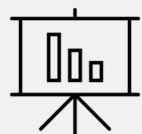
Application is to **BE SUBMITTED ONLINE ONLY**.
CONFIRMATION of the online application must be made no later than **September 15, at 3 pm**.

After confirming the online application, foreign students whose family unit resides abroad and Italian students residing abroad, **MUST UPLOAD** in electronic file format copies of all the documents required (section “Upload documents” - “foreign documentation” in the “Student online services” area of EDiSU website).

ORIGINAL HARD COPIES of the same documents must be submitted to EDiSU by and not later than **September 15, at 3 pm** either **in person** to the office counter (Via Calatafimi, 11) or sent by **postal service** (Via San't Ennodio, 26, 27100 Pavia). Failure to submit these documents to EDiSU within September 15 (in original hard copy), **leads to the exclusion** of the student from the **scholarship ranking list**.

VALUE OF THE SCHOLARSHIP

is differentiated according to both income level, which is determined by the ISEE UNI value, and the student's geographical location of residence.

Deadline to upload the documents required to be considered «off-site» is **NOVEMBER 8, 2026** ("Lease contract" section within the "Online Student Services" area), otherwise you'll be considered a "commuter".

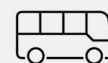

OFF-SITE STUDENTS: residing in municipalities (or foreign countries) from which it is impossible to reach course location via public transport in less than 90 minutes and have secured a paid accommodation near the place of study for a period of **at least 10 months** (for a period of **at least 5 months only** for the students enrolled for the first time in the first-year overtime).

Which means you must have:

- A **RENTAL CONTRACT** in the name of the student or one of his parents, for a tenancy of **at least 10 months (or 5 months for the 1°-year overtime/last semester students)** in the 2026/2027 academic year and registration of the said contract at the Income Revenue Office (Agenzia delle Entrate) OR
- A certification issued by A COLLEGE OR PRIVATE INSTITUTION (for colleges not managed by EDiSU Pavia) showing that the student **is paying to reside** in that facility in the 2026/2027 academic year.

OFF-SITE STUDENTS

If, during the 2026/2027 academic year, you are resident in an **EDiSU college** for at least 10 months (or 5 months for 1°-year overtime students), you **DO NOT HAVE** to submit these documents to be considered off-site.

If you are enrolled in the University of Pavia for the 2026/2027 a.y., and you'll **go abroad for an international mobility programme**

For **no less than 10 months** you'll will be considered "off-site" if:

- You are **resident in Italy in a municipality classified as "off-site"** with respect to the course location or you come from a foreign country and;
- You submit to EDiSU by November 8, 2026 (uploading the file in the "Lease Contract" section of the Online Student Service area of EDiSU website) a declaration (**learning agreement**) or a self-declaration certifying your attendance, during the 2026/2027 a.y., to a university approved international mobility programme, for no less than 10 months.

If you're **going abroad** on projects recognized by the University of Pavia and you're residing, during the 2026/2027 a.y., in an **EDiSU college** **for a period of less than 10 months**, you must submit, by November 8, 2026, only a declaration (learning agreement) confirming your participation in an international mobility programme, indicating the period of the mobility programme (this has to be uploaded in the "Lease contract" section in the "Student online services" area of the EDiSU website).

For **less than 10 months** you'll will be considered "off-site" if:

- You are **resident in Italy in a municipality classified as "off-site"** with respect to the course location or you come from a foreign country and;
- You submit to EDiSU by November 8, 2026 (upload in the "Lease contract" section of the "Student online services" area of EDiSU website) a declaration (**learning agreement**) certifying your participation for the 2026/2027 a.y. in a university approved international mobility programme, with an indication of the period of time spent abroad and;
- You present **a copy of your rental contract** (or private college certificate) for accommodation **in Italy** (along with its registration at **Agenzia delle Entrate**), at the course location, demonstrating the availability of accommodation **for a total of 10 months for the a.y. 2026/2027**.

On-site students (in sede):

- 1° income tier € 2.601,00 + a free meal per day for a total of € 3.430,00
- 2° income tier € 2.162,00 + a free meal per day for a total of € 2.991,00
- 3° income tier € 1.314,00 + a free meal per day for a total of € 2.143,00

Commuting students (pendolare):

- 1° income tier € 3.991,00 + a free meal per day for a total of € 4.820,00
- 2° income tier € 3.362,00 + a free meal per day for a total of € 4.191,00
- 3° income tier € 2.470,00 + a free meal per day for a total of € 3.229,00

Off-site students (fuori sede): residing in “off-site” municipalities and staying in a residence hall or other private or public accommodation for at least 10 months during the 2026/2027 academic year:

- 1° income tier € 7.419,00 + a free meal per day for a total of € 8.248,00
- 2° income tier € 6.343,00 + a free meal per day for a total of € 7.172,00
- 3° income tier € 5.028,00 + a free meal per day for a total of € 5.857,00

Off-site students who are awarded a placement in a college or residence hall managed by EDiSU Pavia: residing in an “off-site” municipality and staying in an EDiSU college for at least 10 months in the 2026/2027 academic year

- 1° income tier € 4.479,00 + college placement and a free meal per day for a total of € 8.248,00
- 2° income tier € 3.403,00 + college placement and a free meal per day for a total of € 7.172,00
- 3° income tier € 2.088,00 + college placement and a free meal per day for a total of € 5.857,00

If a scholarship beneficiary has a certified disability of or exceeding 66%, or has a recognized handicap the amount of the scholarship can be increased up to a maximum of 40%, depending on the disability.

Students who are enrolled in more than one study course at the same time are allowed to obtain and maintain the grant, increased by 20%, if they meet and maintain the merit requirements for the grant for the entire duration of the courses.

FIRST YEAR OVERTIME / PRIMO ANNO

FUORI CORSO: All the above-listed amounts, as well as the related services (college and canteen) provided free of charge, are halved (as well as the international mobility supplement)



FEMALE students enrolled in degree courses in **S.T.E.M.** (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) the amount of the scholarship is increased by 20% (taking as a benchmark the value of the scholarship in the 2nd and 3rd tier)



INTERNATIONAL MOBILITY SUPPLEMENT (for both **BENEFICIARIES** and **ELIGIBLE** students)



Application for additional funds designed for supporting international mobility must be submitted together with the application for scholarship.



Any amounts due will be paid at the end of the mobility period and in any case after the University of Pavia's Office responsible for international exchanges sends EDISU the definitive lists of students involved in study/training programmes abroad.



The sum amounts up to €600,00 monthly for the period spent abroad, up to a maximum of 10 months. Students also have the right to be refunded for travel expenses (round-trip costs) up to a total of **€100,00** for European countries and up to **€500,00** for countries outside Europe.

Any contributions made with EU funds, as a result of bilateral agreements (even with partners outside the EU) or with funds made available by other public or private parties, are detracted from the sum dispensed by EDISU.

 Scholarship recipients enrolled in degree courses based in cities where there is no canteen affiliated with EDiSU ([CREMONA](#), [VOGHERA](#), [VIGEVANO](#)) or who are enrolled on the “[ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE](#)” degree course are *entitled to receive the monetary value* of the flat-rate catering fee. So, if they're going to an EDiSU canteen, they'll hence pay for the meal according to their income tier.

WHO CAN ASK FOR THE REFUND OF THE MEAL SHARE?

Students beneficiaries and students who are only eligible for a scholarship, but not beneficiaries, who choose **NOT** to use the catering service, are **NOT ENTITLED** to any reimbursement.

PROCEDURE BY WHICH RANKING LISTS ARE FORMED

STUDENTS ENROLLED IN THE FIRST YEAR

is based on the **ISEE UNI 2026 statement** referring to the student's family unit scaled to the ISEE limit of € 26.887,93



Maximum of 1000 points

STUDENTS ENROLLED IN SUBSEQUENT YEARS

Positioning in the ranking list depends on the total score resulting from the sum of

the score based on the **number of credits** achieved by August 10th, 2026, (maximum 600 points)



the score determined by the **average mark (weighted average)** of the student's exams passed (maximum 400 points)

Maximum of 1000 points

It is responsibility of the student: A) to ascertain that his Booklet contains **records of every exam the student has passed** (those included in the most recently approved study plan) B) to notify EDiSU, when the provisional ranking list is issued, if there are **any missing records** or cases of “pending approval”.

Non 1°-year students: Positioning within the ranking list depends on the score attributed to the applicant, shown from the highest to the lowest. Scores being equal, the student who has not made use of his bonus will rank higher and, following, the student with the higher income score. In case there still exists a tie, the student enrolled in the more advanced year of his course will rank higher and, thereafter, the youngest student will be given preference.

1° year students: Positioning within the ranking list depends on the score attributed to the applicant, shown from the highest to the lowest. Scores being equal, it precedes the student enrolled in a higher-level course. Should scores be again equal, the student with the higher mark on his previous qualifications will rank higher and, thereafter, the youngest student will be given preference.

Students with disabilities, if included in a ranking list of eligible applicants, have the right to receive a scholarship even if this means exceeding the total number of available scholarships indicated in the present Call for Applications.

RANKING LISTS PUBLICATION

The **PROVISIONAL RANKING LIST** will be made public by **OCTOBER 29, 2026**, and will be posted on the “Online Student Services” area.

In the provisional ranking, **students from “off-site” municipalities** or from **foreign countries**, with the exception of those who will reside at an EDiSU College for the entire 2026/2027 academic year (at least 10 months), **will TEMPORARILY result in the “commuter” status.**

Any **request to review** the provisional ranking lists must be submitted to EDiSU in the “Online Student Services” area **no later than 10 days** following publication of the provisional ranking lists.

EDiSU website -> Online students services -> Upshot Ranking -> provisional ranking list -> **BUTTON «istanza di revisione** – review request» at the end of the page

Students who, in the provisional ranking, were excluded as the result of a **non-compliant ISEE 2026**, **don't need to submit a request for review** but must request **no later than 10 days** from the publication of the provisional rankings, the release of a **new ISEE 2026 certification** for the right to university study, compliant to the regulations.

The student required to submit “**foreign documentation**” may improve/supplement, by and no later than **the given deadline (10 days)** the “foreign documentation” already submitted in original to EDiSU and declared incomplete.

The **outcome of the review** will be announced to the student directly in the “Online Student Services area / Ranking results” section and, **if accepted**, will produce effects in **the final ranking**.

The right to benefit from the scholarship ceases when the student achieves the degree BEFORE the final ranking list is approved



N.B.

The **DEFINITIVE RANKING LIST** will be made public by **DECEMBER 4, 2026**

The definitive rankings will list the beneficiary and the eligible, non-beneficiary, students for the 2026/2027 a.y. and the final **geographical condition** of each student is defined (**on-site/commuter/off-site**).

TERMS OF PAYMENT OF GRANTS AND SUPPLEMENTS

STUDENTS ENROLLED IN THE FIRST YEAR

- ★ 1^o INSTALMENT is equal (at least) to 50% of the value of the scholarship, and **is made up primarily of the share in services** of the scholarship:
 - ✓ N.1 **free meal** per day from 1 January until 31 December 2027
 - ✓ **Bed free** for the academic year 2026/2027 if the student is the winner of accommodation in EDiSU colleges as an "off-site" student

A monetary share will also be recognized if the share in services is less than 50% of the total value of the scholarship and will be liquidated **by 31st December 2026 (see last slide)**

- ★ 2^o INSTALMENT, corresponding to the remaining value of the scholarship not already paid with the first instalment, will be paid, **starting from May 2027**

BUT only after EDiSU has ensured that the student has achieved, **within 10th August 2027** at least the number of CFU indicated in Attachment B



STUDENTS ENROLLED IN SUBSEQUENT YEARS

- ★ 1^o INSTALMENT will be **disbursed in services** (NO monetary share):
 - ✓ N.1 **free meal** per day from 1 January until 31 December 2027
 - ✓ **Bed free** for the academic year 2026/2027 if the student is the winner of accommodation in EDiSU colleges as an "off-site" student

- ★ 2^o INSTALMENT will consist of a cash payment equal to:

50% of the total value of the grant  the value of the service fee already received with the 1st instalment

Paid starting from **MARCH 2027**

The 2nd instalment will not be paid to off-site students residing in EDiSU colleges whose service fee, acknowledged with the 1st instalment, **is equal to or greater than 50% of the total value of the scholarship.**

- ★ 3^o INSTALMENT will consist of a cash payment equal to the value of the scholarship not already recognized/liquidated with the first two instalments.

Paid by **JUNE 2027**

STUDENTS ENROLLED IN THE FILTER SEMESTER

Students who enrol in the “*filter semester*”, in Pavia, will be put in a special ranking list, published according to the timelines prescribed by the MUR, ONLY if in the 2° semester will be proven *enrolled, at Pavia university* in a:

- ★ Single cycle master’s degree in Medicine and Surgery or in Dentistry and Dental Prosthodontics (as being ranked in a useful position in the national ranking);
- ★ Similar course, as per art. 8, comma 1, of MD May 30, 2025, n. 418, indicated at the time of enrolment in the “filter semester” (as being ranked NOT in a useful position in the national ranking).

For those students who will enroll in the “*filter semester*” at another University and will then enroll *in Pavia in the 2° semester*, they have to apply for EDiSU Pavia benefits within the deadlines that will be determined in relation to the timeline of the national ranking drawn up by the MUR. These students, for the purpose of assessing income requirements, must still be in possession of an *ISEE 2026 certificate* valid for the right to university study or of the foreign documentation necessary for the calculation of the equalized ISEE with income/assets related to the year 2025 (see article 4.2.2).

In this regard, *an addendum* to the present call will be approved and *published on EDiSU website – news section*.

TRANSFERS

- ★ If the student *transfers to another university*, after the start of the a.y., the scholarship application submitted to EDiSU Pavia will be sent, upon the written request of the student, by EDiSU to the University to which the student has requested to be transferred. In this case the student will lose any benefit/funding which he might have been awarded by EDiSU (and in time will have to return any amounts that have been disbursed).
- ★ If the student *transfers from another university* to the University of Pavia, after the start of the a.y., he will have to request the transmission of his application from the previous institution supporting the right to university study to EDiSU Pavia, provided that it is submitted before the deadline given in the Call for Applications. Regularization of the student transfer process must be completed by November 16, 2026.

HOW TO RECEIVE THE PAYMENT OF THE CASH PORTION OF THE SCHOLARSHIP

- 1 If beneficiary, you need to go to the EDiSU website and log into the “ONLINE STUDENT SERVICES” area
- 2 You then need to fill out the IBAN section present in your personal area
- 3 You need to confirm that you’re NOT recipient of other scholarships incompatible with the one issued by EDiSU Pavia (“SCHOLARSHIP RESERVATION COMMITMENT” section)



IMPORTANT

If you don't complete this procedure you **WILL NOT receive** the payment of the cash portion of the scholarship!
(The payment procedure **requires technical times** and therefore the payment order and the actual transfer of the money on the student's bank account **DO NOT OCCUR simultaneously**, it may take even a month).
